Downtown Hood River transforms after Thanksgiving, with snow-dusted sidewalks lined with twinkle-lit trees, warm drinks in mittened hands, and neighbors spreading holiday cheer. The season officially begins with the <u>Annual Tree Lighting & Street Festival</u> on Friday, Dec. 5, when downtown transforms into a pedestrian- and family-friendly plaza filled with caroling, cocoa, music, and the glow of a community tree that brings everyone together.

### 2. Shop Local with Heart

On Saturday, Nov. 29, celebrate with *Shop Local*, *Shop Small*, a festive downtown event filled with handcrafted goods, seasonal specials, and neighborhood cheer. To make holiday browsing easier, the City of Hood River offers free downtown parking Dec. 9 - 24. The Hood River Visitor Center also provides complimentary gift wrapping on weekends before and after Thanksgiving, for locally purchased items accompanied by a receipt. Opening on Nov. 21, <u>Handmade for the Holidays</u> at Columbia Center for the Arts features a thoughtfully curated collection of art, ornaments, and gifts by regional makers, transforming holiday shopping into a personal and memorable experience.
